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

Record 2023 for the Prague Marriott

The Prague Marriott was visited in 2023 by almost 120,000 guests, a 12.5% increase on 2022. More than half (57%) were business clients, but leisure guests (43%) also appreciated the quality of services and the hotel's attractive location in central Prague. "Most visitors came from the USA, their numbers more than tripling when compared to the pre-Covid years," states Robert Grader, general director of the Prague Marriott, adding that in addition to US tourists, the number of Taiwanese and Korean travellers also saw a significant rise last year. Their return to Prague was down to the reinstatement of direct flights between Prague and Seoul last March, and Taipei in July 2023. This year the hotel will focus on strengthening its F&B position. At a meeting on 12th of February, Prague city council took the decision to issue a tender for conference tourism promotion services in the capital between 2024 and 2027. The successful applicant will provide services to promote conference and event tourism as well as consulting services for organisers such as data collection and information on similar events in Prague. RegioJet Launches Advance Tickets Sales for Spring and Summer 2024

The private rail and coach company RegioJet launched advance sale tickets for the spring and summer seasons. Tickets are on sale for all commercial train and coach services, including international routes to European cities. Advance tickets sales for domestic services linking Prague with Ostrava and Brno will also be launched. Passengers can also use the company's signature yellow trains and coaches to reach forthcoming significant cultural and sporting events taking place in Czechia and around Europe – the ice hockey world championships in Prague and Ostrava, and the summer Olympic Games in Paris, for instance. České dráhy: Record-breaking Number of Passengers with Impaired Mobility and Orientation Transported

Last year, České dráhy provided assistance to a recordbreaking number of passengers with impaired mobility. More than 8,500 transport operations were made through the ordering system of the largest Czech railway carrier last year. Thanks to the expanding network of wheelchair-accessible trains, thousands of other people with impaired mobility travelled without the assistance of the carrier, and therefore they are not included in the statistics. Over the last six years, i.e. from 2018 to 2023, České dráhy provided travel assistance to more than 41,000 passengers with impaired mobility and orientation.



Leo Express offers free ski and snowboard transport until the end of March

Until the end of March, Leo Express offers free transport of cross-country skis, skis and snowboards in the Czech Republic and Slovakia. Passengers can use the service, for example, when traveling to the Slovak Tatras to the stations of Liptovský Mikuláš, Štrba or Poprad, or on regional trains to the station of Králíky in the Dolní Morava region. The trains continue the commercial connection between Prague and Ostrava.

Czechia to be directly connected with Kazakhstan

After a four-year break, it will be possible to use direct flights from Prague to Astana. This May, SCAT Airlines is to launch its service to Kazakhstan scheduled twice a week every Wednesday and Saturday operated by Boeing 737-800 aircraft for 189 passengers. A direct connection to Central Asia will promote interesting opportunities for business cooperation between the two countries, as well as tourism.





Performance of Accommodation Facilities in 2023

Data from the Association of Hotels and Restaurants (AHR ČR) indicates that last year Czechia saw a further increase in guest numbers, and that accommodation rates increased year-on-year by an average of 10%, 12% in Prague. Occupancy numbers were also affected by a further increase in domestic tourists who also display growing expectations when it comes to facilities and services. Prague's four- and five-star hotels achieved an average annual occupancy rate of almost 71%, 12% more than in 2022. The average price of accommodation was €110.4, which is €13 higher than in the previous year. Compared to neighbouring capitals, Prague is €21 cheaper than Vienna and €10 cheaper than Budapest and Berlin. Source: AHR ČR





Young people are more sensitive to the climate crisis, it affects where and how they travel

Most of them are still in high school, but they are already influencing the future of society, including the labour market. Generation Z, people born between 1996 and 2009. According to a survey by CzechTourism, 87% of Generation Z are affected by it, and a fifth of them want to actively address it.

Tourists Numbers Reach Pre-Covid Levels

Last year almost ten million foreign tourists (43.3 % of the total number) stayed in official accommodation facilities in Czechia. Almost 12.5 million further guests were Czechs (56.7%) who stayed in these facilities while on holiday. In total, the number tourists who headed to Czechia came to over 22 million, a year-on-year increase of 13.5%. The data shows that tourism is back on the levels seen before the pandemic. Prague Provides PCT with 22 million crowns for Tourism Promotion

Prague City Council has approved a 22 million crown funding package for marketing campaigns aimed at promoting incoming tourism. The Sázava Valley is the main backdrop and for several years fans of the game have been exploring how the landscape and architecture have changed over time. The medieval underground spaces beneath Pilsen city centre have reopened once again after the January break and will operate until the end of the year. The over 800m-long tour route, nine to 12 metres below street level, is open to visitors daily from 10am until 6pm. 

The Vír Factory Set to Open Soon

The revitalisation of the former Rotter Factory near the Vírská Dam on the River Svratka is in full swing. The erstwhile textile plant is being transformed into a complex that will contribute to the quality of tourist services in the region. On opening this spring, it will offer good-quality and affordable accommodation, conference facilities, a cafeteria offering dishes made using fresh regional produce, an outdoor shop, a sports equipment hire shop and other services. Further additions such as a hydroponic farm, a fish farm, a fruit drying facility, a juicing plant and a farmer's shop are also planned. A newly certified tourist information centre is also part of the complex.

The Slovácko Region Set to Open Two New Houses of Nature

Nature is one of the greatest treasures the Slovácko Region possesses and this fact will be highlighted at two new Houses of Nature. One of these will be the gateway to the White Carpathians, the other to Hodonínské Dúbravy area. Both facilities will be modern and feature interactive exhibitions. The White Carpathians House of Nature was created by renovating an old house on the historical Bartolomějské Square in Veselí nad Moravou. It will open on 16th March. The Hodonínská Dúbrava House of Nature is also a rebuild – this was once an eco-educational centre. This is set to open in May or June of 2024. The Roof Terrace of the Bat'a Skyscraper Now Reopened

Following reconstruction work, the roof terrace atop the Bat'a skyscraper in Zlín reopened in February. At 77.5m, iconic building No. 21 was the tallest building in prewar Czechoslovakia and in its time the second tallest building in Europe. It was opened as the headquarters of the Bat'a company in 1939. Nicknamed the Zlín skyscraper, the building is now open to the public, and following renovation work tourists can see its without scaffolding, take a ride in the legendary lift containing the office of Bat'a's directors or jump aboard the high-speed lift to the 16th floor where they can have a coffee on the roof terrace.

Welcome to Czechia Digital Media Library The Digital Media Library is a central hub for all of CzechTourism branded assets. It is a tool intended to support the tourism industry by providing assets for people to use to promote Czechia as a visitor destination. The Digital Media Library is free to use as long as you follow our <u>Terms of Use</u>, Licence rules, Usage instructions, and Expiry dates for each asset.



Do you need images, video, logos or entire brochures in your work promoting Czechia? You'll find them on a cloud storage facility called Digital Media Library that CzechTourism launched in 2022. The multimedia travel-themed content can be accessed at media. visitczechia.com and is (depending on the specific rights) designed for professionals and the wider public. Just in the last year some 1496 items were added to this digital library, and at present you can choose from 9610 files. Over 1800 users from 73 countries have registered to use the Digital Media Library, and most are satisfied with the content, the library gaining 8.7 points from a possible 10 in a customer satisfaction survey. The most popular searches were Český Krumlov (over 7,500 searches) and Prague (over 3,500 searches). Since it was launched, the library has registered over 22,000 downloads.
