

Fairmont in Prague to open in March

The Fairmont Golden Prague hotel is set to open by 1st March of next year. This luxury hotel located in a listed brutalist building at the end of Pařížská Street in Prague will offer 320 rooms and suites. Guests can enjoy a spa offering saunas and steam baths as well as curative procedures based on traditional, tried-and-tested methods. Guests will also be able to make use of indoor and outdoor pools. Food service will be based on traditional cuisine but there will also be a few surprises served in the hotel's six eateries. Chomutov attracts visitors with food experiences

In central Chomutov, a town in the Ústí Region, Hotel BOBR has reopened following reconstruction work. Etihad Airways to link Prague with Abu Dhabi

From June 2nd 2025, Etihad Airways will operate direct flights to Abu Dhabi. Prague's Václav Havel airport will once again be linked to the capital of the United Arab Emirates after almost eleven years. The airline will use a Boeing B787-9 Dreamliner with 270 seats for the route. There will be flights four times a week, every Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Sunday.

Czechia remains at the top of world beer tourism

Czechia is attracting ever greater numbers of tourists with its rich beer traditions. According to the latest statistics from CzechTourism, Pilsen's Prazdroj Brewery which received almost 530,000 visitors last year, and beer attractions in Žatec such as the Temple of Hops and Beer and the Hop Museum are among the most popular beer destinations. Beer spas have seen significant increases, and their popularity is on the rise across the country.



South Bohemian Region attracts culture tourists from all over the world

In the second quarter of this year the hotels, guesthouses and suites of Prague, South Moravia and South Bohemia regions accommodated the most guests in the country - 2.1 million, 589,000 and 454,000 respectively. Tourists stayed longest in the Carlsbad Region, spending 4.66 days there on average. The national average was 3.34 days, in South Bohemia, where the Český Krumlov International Music Festival takes place, travellers stayed an average of 3.35 days. This is the data from Tourdata.cz, a website operated by CzechTourism, a partner of the 33rd edition of the Krumlov festival.

Following reconstruction work, the Hotel Slezský dům reopened this September at the Schroth spa in Dolní Lipová. This new gateway to the spa saw rebuilding work take place on buildings in the spa park. The hotel received a completely new spa reception and comfortable accommodation for spa guests. Prague extends the Prague Visitor Pass into Central Bohemia

The capital and the Central Bohemia Region have a signed an agreement to trial the Prague Visitor Pass outside of the capital. In the pilot phase, it will be possible to use the card to visit attractions in Kutná Hora. If the project proves successful, this will be extended to other places. People will be able to use the card as a ticket to tourist spots such as museums, galleries, zoos as well as on public transport. The pilot project was approved by Prague city council in mid-September.

Central Bohemian Region

Region to support destination management companies with 9.6 million crowns

The Central Bohemia Regional Assembly has announced a subsidy program to promote the development of destination management companies within the region. The aim of the program is to professionalize certified destination management companies. Applications can be submitted between 29th October and 12th November 2024. For 2025, the Central Bohemia Region has once again allocated a sum of 9.6 million crowns to support destination management companies. The subsidies are aimed at the development of tourist products, publication of promotional materials, the creation of multimedia presentations, training, workshops and other key activities. The money will also cover web admin, social media and staff wages.

Emil Filla at Peruc Chateau

The Emil Filla Memorial Hall has opened at Peruc Chateau. Working with the Emil Filla Foundation and the Benedikt Rejt Gallery in Louny, Filla's works are presented in a way that this great Czech artist of the first half of the 20th century deserves. The initiator of the exhibition is the art historian Tomáš Winter. Bearing the title "The Eagle will tear apart the Eagle: Emil Filla, Chinese art and the ghosts of the Totalitarian System", Emil Filla's is displayed in context with his collection of Asian art, his later depictions of the landscapes of the České Středohoří Mountains and his Cubist still life paintings that make up the lion's share of the gallery's collections.

South Bohemian Region



Reconstruction of the Bellaria Summer Mansion in Český Krumlov

In the last two years, this well-preserved rococo building in the gardens at Český Krumlov chateau has undergone complete reconstruction. In the Bellaria's cellars visitors can see the baroque kitchens and food preparation areas complete with 18th-century lifts – the largest could carry food from the kitchen up three storeys to the Upper Hall while the smaller "Magic Table" elevated dishes to the food preparation room where it was arranged for serving in the dining room. Another interesting spot is the grotto with its stucco decorated with thousands of clam shells, fragments of glass and mirrors. The walls of the halls on both upper floors boast frescoes by František Jakub Prokyš dating from the 18th century.


Vysočina Region

Industrial via ferrata and chimney bungee jumps

Part of the Vír Factory, which is located near an eponymous reservoir on the River Svratka, has undergone a transformation and is becoming a place of fun and thrills. Visitors can try out a unique via ferrata here which climbs a 46m-tall chimney and an adjacent granary. You can climb to the top of the chimney on metal steps, and you can spice up the descent with a daring bungee jump from a height of 26m. Or you can abseil.

All change at the top of the regional tourist board

Martin Soukup, director of the Hradec Králové Region Tourist Board, has resigned and will leave the organisation at the end of the year. The region has announced a selection process to find a new director. The application deadline is 11th October. "Those with a university education, ideally in tourism or marketing, and with a minimum of five years' experience plus the necessary skills to head up our organisation can apply," stated regional deputy governor Martina Berdychová, whose remit includes tourism. The main activities of the tourist board are to promote tourism in the region, cooperate with destination management companies and nurture common interests with consultative bodies in the development of the tourism industry.

Liberec Region



Region to buy back and restore Ještěd - support for project preparation

Efforts by the Liberec Region to bring the hotel at Ještěd back to life are continuing. In June, a memorandum was signed on the possibility of purchasing the structure and joining the Ještěd 73 association. The actual preparation for the project to attain the building permit for the restoration of this national cultural monument is thus a step closer. When they are finalise, these plans might also put an exact sum on how much modernization would cost. The regional council in August agreed to provide a special-purpose subsidy for the aforementioned plans to the tune of five million crowns from the Liberec Region budget.

New tours at Šternberk Castle

Šternberk Castle is offering tourists a new tour called Technology at the castle. This physically challenging tour shows visitors the lifts for food and people (regarded as a real gem at the castle), the servants' quarters, the rooms belonging to the former owners of the castle and the attic. The last place is where visitors can see the still-functional lift machine room and Šternberk Castle's extensive attic space. The route takes visitors to the reconstructed Liechtenstein kitchen which was the "operational nerve centre" of every noble residence. Another new stop is the Ledovna building in the castle park.

Region to support electric boats on Slezská Harta reservoir and selected tourist trains

Over the next three years, the Moravia-Silesia Region will support water transport on the Slezská Harta reservoir and will also contribute the operation of special trains. The Hvozdnický express, the Osoblažka service and specials run by the Silesian Railway Association will all receive regional funds. Between 2025 and 2027, some 6.1 million crowns will go towards supporting this branch of the tourist industry.


